





***Encyclopaedia Iranica* Volume XVI Published, July 2021**



The Yarshater Center is pleased to announce that Volume XVI of Columbia University’s *Encyclopaedia Iranica* was published in July 2021 (<https://brill.com/view/title/61057>). This bound volume replaces the older unbound fascicles XVI.1 through XVI.6 dating from 2012–2020. It covers the same alphabetical range, Kashan to Khorasan, but as a revised and expanded edition adds over forty pages of new material, incorporates numerous addenda and corrigenda as well as updated articles, and includes improved maps and color illustrations.




Honorary Doctorate for Mohsen Ashtiany Announced

On Tuesday October 19, 2021, a ceremony was held in the Senate Room of the Rectorate, University of Rome “La Sapienza,” to confer a doctorate degree honoris causa in the field of Civilizations of Asia and Africa on Mohsen Ashtiany of the Ehsan Yarshater Center for Iranian Studies at Columbia University. The honorary degree recognizes the service Mohsen Ashtiany has rendered to Iranian studies throughout his life’s work, as well as for the wide recognition of his contribution in the scholarly community and among the Iranian intellectual diaspora. Speakers at the ceremony included Antonella Polimeni (Rector of Sapienza University of Rome), Federica Casalin (Coordinator of the Doctoral Program in Civilizations of Asia and Africa, Sapienza University), Carlo Cereti (Professor at Sapienza University), and Elton L. 

History of Persian Literature V: Persian Prose Published, August 2021

Volume V of *A History of Persian Literature* presents a broad survey of Persian prose: from biographical, historiographical, and didactic prose, to scientific manuals and works of popular prose fiction. It analyzes the rhetorical devices employed by writers in different periods in their philosophical and political discourse; or when their aim is primarily to entertain rather than to instruct, the chapters describe different techniques used to transform old stories and familiar tales into novel versions to entice their audience.



Many of the texts in prose cited in the volume share a wealth of common lore and literary allusions with Persian poetry. Prose and poetry frequently appear on the same page in tandem. In different ways, therefore, this creative interplay demonstrates the perennial significance of intertextuality, from the earliest times to the present; and help us in the process to further our understanding and enhance our enjoyment of Persian literature in its different manifestations throughout history.


Yarshater Center's Mahnaz Moazami Publishes Latest Book: *Laws of Ritual Purity*

Mahnaz Moazami, Associate Research Scholar at the Yarshater Center and Associate Editor of the *Encyclopaedia Iranica*, recently published her latest book, *Laws of Ritual Purity, Zand ī Fragard ī Jud-Dēw-Dād (A Commentary on the Chapters of the Widēwdād)*.

Laws of Ritual Purity describes the various ways in which Zoroastrian authorities in the fifth-sixth centuries CE reinterpreted the purity laws of their community. Its redactor(s), conversant with the notions and practices of purity and impurity as developed by their predecessors, attempt(s) to determine the parameters of the various categories of pollution, the minimum measures of polluted substances, and the effect of the interaction of pollution with other substances that are important to humans. It is therefore in essence a technical legal corpus designed to provide a comprehensive picture of a central aspect of Zoroastrian ritual life: the extent of one's liability contracting pollution and how atonement/purification can be achieved.

The main focus of Dr. Moazami's research is on the history of Ancient and Late Antique Iran. Her other publications include *Wrestling with the Demons of the Pahlavi Widēwdād* (2014), an important source for the study of Zoroastrian beliefs and literature.
